## HOLIDAY & WINTER RECYCLING GUIDELINES

With the holiday season upon us and the winter months fast approaching here are a few guidelines and reminders for the public to keep in mind.

- Clean boxes and hard plastic packaging can go in the recycling hopper, no Styrofoam, plastic bags or wrappers please. Large boxes should be broken down. Mixed packaging, wrapping paper, bows, ribbons, Styrofoam and plastic bags can go in the trash hopper. We understand it's a busy time for all please do your best to recycle your holiday trash.
- Christmas trees (the real kind) are free to dispose of at the Transfer Station until Town Meeting, There will be a designated area for dropping them off. Trees should be free of decorations.
- Wreaths are free to dispose of until Town Meeting. Wreaths **DO NOT** go in the recycling or trash, there will be hoppers clearly marked for wreath disposal at the Recycling Center.
- Salted sand is available in the Quonset hut behind the Recycling Center, there is a 2 bucket (5 gallon) limit, per storm for residents. For those who can't fill their own buckets an attendant at the Recycling Center will be glad to assist you.
- Neither the Recycling Center nor Transfer Station accepts any kind of ash for disposal. We recommend composting your ashes. Ashes should never be thrown into the recycling or trash hoppers, this can cause a fire in the containers.
- With the winter season comes bad weather and the possibility of snow days and early closings. Please be aware of the weather and the potential for the facility to be closed. The facility will not open until it is safe for residents to enter, priority is given to the Recycling Center followed by the Transfer Station.
- If the gate is partially closed we are **CLOSED.** Plow and sand trucks need access during bad weather and off hours. Residents are not allowed in the facility when closed.
- The staff of the Recycling Center & Transfer Station would like to wish everyone a safe and happy holiday season.
