### Town of Harpswell Multi-Site Application for Pesticide Use Waivers

The Outdoor Pesticides Control and Fertilizer Use Ordinance provides that the Conservation Commission may grant a waiver for the use of pesticides that are otherwise restricted if certain conditions are met. An application for a pesticide use waiver must be completed by an applicator licensed by the Maine Pesticide Control Board. A licensed applicator may use this form to apply for waivers for **multiple properties** if all of the following conditions are met:

- The pesticide and concentration proposed to be used is the same for all properties
- The method of application will be the same for all properties
- The primary reason for requesting the waivers is the same for all properties – either an immediate threat to human health OR an immediate threat of substantial property damage

If those conditions are all met, complete the following information on this application form and provide the requested information for each property or site on the attached spreadsheet.

2. Pesticide and concentration proposed to be used: Acephate (97%) <sup>15g Ace-jet pack</sup> per 100 ml of water


A. Describe why the control methods allowed in the ordinance are not adequate to address the threat – be specific: There are no effective sprays that can be used so close to the water.
